Facility Description

Group 3 of 8 is the Logistics Group (also known as Supply and Services). This Group includes an Ethylene Oxide (EO) Distribution Unit which unloads ethylene oxide; a Barge Operations Process to load and unload barges; a Tank Truck and Rail Car Operations Process to load and unload tank trucks and rail cars; and the Plant Lab.

Title V Program Applicability Basis

State Only:

This facility has the potential to emit over 100 TPY of CO, NOx, and VOC's, as well as over 10 TPY of a single HAP and 25 TPY of total HAP's. Due to the facility-wide potential to emit over 100 tons per year of criteria pollutants, over 10 tons per year of a single HAP, and over 25 tons per year of aggregate HAPs, Union Carbide Corporation is required to have an operating permit pursuant to Title V of the Federal Clean Air Act as amended and 45CSR30.

Legal and Factual Basis for Permit Conditions

The State and Federally-enforceable conditions of the Title V Operating Permits are based upon the requirements of the State of West Virginia Operating Permit Rule 45CSR30 for the purposes of Title V of the Federal Clean Air Act and the underlying applicable requirements in other state and federal rules.
